Dear Father Flatley:

As I indicated to you in our telephone consultation on Wednesday, March 8, 1995, Father Dennis Keefe has sought my counsel regarding the allegations made against him by [REDACTED] of Natick, Massachusetts.

In response to your letter and summary of account dated March 9, 1995, there are several sections of the summary that we wish to clarify.

In the first paragraph, Father Stankard informed Father Keefe on Saturday, March 4, 1995, not Friday.

In the third paragraph, Father Keefe's response "That is not true." referred to several facts: the first being that he did not, at any time, touch [REDACTED] improperly. Secondly, the location of the "office" that [REDACTED] referred to is on the main floor of the rectory, not the second floor.

In Paragraph Five, the quote "If he ever said stop, I would have." refers to the casual touching of [REDACTED] shoulder, and touching of his back cited in your summary and not in reference to hugging and wrestling. As Father Keefe stated to you, he never wrestled or hugged [REDACTED] or any other person at St. Stephen's.-

In Paragraph Six, Second Sentence, Christina was in the rectory kitchen and moving about the area at the time that the ice pack was given to [REDACTED].

As best Father Keefe can remember, on one occasion prior to the ice pack being given to [REDACTED], he observed Father Stankard praying over [REDACTED]'s leg.

We would appreciate it if you would attach this letter of charges and corrections to your summary statement.


